Search engines, like Google, are so popular that many people use the search feature instead of typing a URL. For instance, people may quickly search for their electricity provider's name to find the online payment portal. And for this week's scam, that's exactly what cybercriminals want you to do. This scam tries to trick you into clicking on a fake ad instead of the billing portal that you're trying to find. The scammers purchase a variety of fake utility payment advertisements, and you see those ads during your searches. They know that they can trick you more easily if you contact them instead of them reaching out to you.

If you click on one of these ads, you will be prompted to dial a phone number. Dialing the number puts you directly in contact with a scammer. They may try to scare you by saying your bill must be paid immediately. Or they may tempt you with an offer to help you save money—but only if you act now. Neither the advertisement nor the person you are talking to is legitimate. Paying them won't help with your utility bills, but the scammer might use you to help pay their own bills!

Follow these tips to avoid falling victim to a utility bill scam:

• Remember, anyone can purchase an advertisement. Be cautious when clicking on ads, even if they seem relevant to you.

• Scammers often ask you to make payments using unusual methods, such as gift cards or money transfers. If something seems strange about a financial transaction, stop immediately!

• If an offer seems too good to be true, it probably is. Always stop and think before taking action.

April is Distracted Drivers Awareness Month. There are three main types of distracted driving. Visual, taking your eyes off the road for any reason. Manual, taking your hands off the steering wheel. Cognitive – taking your mind off driving. Texting while driving engages all three and is the worst form of distracted driving.

In Michigan, it is illegal to manually use a cell phone or other mobile electronic device while operating a vehicle on Michigan roads. Under the law, a driver cannot hold or support a phone or other device with any part of their hands, arms, or shoulders. Even if a cell phone or other device is mounted on your dashboard or connected to your vehicle's built-in system, you cannot use your hands to operate it beyond a single touch.

This law is hoping to reduce distracted driving. First time violators will be facing a \$100 fine and/or 16 hours of community service. Subsequent violations result in a \$250 fine and/or 24 hours of community service. 3 violations within a 3 year period result in completing a driver improvement class. If a traffic crash occurs and the atfault driver was holding or manually using a mobile device while operating the vehicle, any civil fines will be doubled.

The best alternatives include using Bluetooth. You can use hands-free technology or other integrated voice command systems. Anything more than a single touch is against the law. For more information, visit the Michigan State Police website at Michigan gov/msp

Remember, this is a "light" home repair program, and there will be a fee for services, based on you and your spouse's income. You will be responsible for purchase of all materials needed. We do have small grants that can assist with purchase of materials and Handyman time, but these are small, are first come first serve and are grants that go quickly.

So what can the Handyman Program repair? Below is a list of what can be done by our Handyman.

Minor water leaks including replacement of faucet

Broken door handles or locks

Installation of grab bars, handrails or other safety items in the home, with the exclusion of jobs requiring specialty tools

Installation of smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors

Weatherization of windows and doors

Change light bulbs in and out of home


