


Fall Flu Clinic

This year the fall flu vaccine will protect against the influenza A H3N2 virus, the Wisconsin influenza B virus and the 2009 H1N1 virus. Everyone is encouraged to get a flu shot, although certain people are at a greater risk for serious complications from the flu. These include: older people, young children, people with chronic lung disease (such as asthma & Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease), diabetes, heart disease, neurologic conditions, and certain other long-term health conditions, pregnant women.

Those allergic to chicken eggs, have experience an allergic reaction to flu vaccines in the past, or who have had Guillain-Barre Syndrome (GBS) should talk with their doctor about other ways to prevent getting the flu. If you are ill with a fever (i.e. temperature of 100 degrees) you should wait until your symptoms pass to get vaccinated.

What to bring: Those who have Medicare Part B, bring your red-white-and-blue card Medicare card, in order to bill Medicare. If you do not have health insurance, the cost of the vaccine is \$25.00. Cost may be determined based on income.

Seniors are encouraged to wear short sleeves or sleeves that can easily be rolled up. Bring your driver's license or other ID, as this assists staff and volunteers when preparing the paperwork for billing Medicare.
